NEW CLUBROOMS – PAST, CURRENT AND FUTURE

Renovating or building is said to stress the family dynamics – well this is certainly the case with the ACWFC clubroom build. We are all sick and tired of the build and the time and effort it has taken for a large number of people. We just want it finished so we can get on with what we are here for – **football!** But we need a home and a home we shall have soon.

Just recapping on where we started - the original clubrooms were burnt down in December 2006. At the time we thought we had reached rock bottom. However over the years new 'rock bottoms' were reached with burglary, another fire, loss of more stock – it just kept going on and on.

With typical ACWFC resolve metal containers were brought in to ensure vandals, thieves and arsonists were kept out. Meanwhile the original building subcommittee commenced the long road of planning to build in the Adelaide Parklands.

At the end of 2010 the shell of the new building was at a standstill, the stress of the organising was too much and a new building subcommittee was formed. ACWFC, as sub lease holder, was at the time at real risk of losing the lot – grounds and clubrooms – we even had an eviction date from the Adelaide City Council (ACC)!

With the new building subcommittee - Joe Tripodi (our club patron), Shaun McColl (ex-vice president and ex-Chairman of the club), John Hopwood (currently acting President) , Michael Burnett (legal – committee rep.), Cristina Nadasan (architect) and Gill Kette (Club Secretary), we negotiated a way forward with ACC using the Property division (Heg Wirthensohn) to resolve a number of outstanding issues. This has taken and continues to take a great deal of time as there are a number of matters that require regular meetings in order to keep the build moving and maintain the confidence of the council.

We were fortunate that in early 2011 we were able to obtain a Facility grant and Activity Grant from the Office of Recreation and Sport. ACWFC had money to re-start the build! We are very much in debt to Shaun McColl for his expertise in procuring these grants for us. We are also indebted to other members of the new building sub committee including Joe Tripodi who continues to be 'hands on' and has donated funds and equipment and expertise to keep us going.

With the help and guidance of Joe Tripodi we have been able to appoint a new builder - Tim Power who has successfully completed a number of outstanding issues with the build and is moving the external build to completion – finally we have a builder who is delivering!

Tim has devised clever lateral solutions to the problems of the build with the sole intention of providing ACWFC players and families a safe and aesthetically pleasing home. The terms of our grants are prescriptive and ACC have helped us by certifying work for payment each fortnight. This has increased the workload of our Treasurer Louise Rigoni. Louise is doing a fantastic job in keeping us on track with the funds and ensuring proper acquittal.

More funds will be required soon and Jane Rathjen the committee's sponsor and grants manager is waiting to apply for more funding once we have acquitted the current Office of Recreation and Sports grants.

John Hopwood has teamed up with David Withers from Lang Group to oversee the internal work. At present, structural beams have been placed, toilets re-instated and donation of gas hot water service was gratefully received. Quality Electrical Services are waiting to install the new electrical box and wiring for lights. We have apprentice cabinet makers who in conjunction with their employer will construct the kitchen and seating in the change rooms. The list of jobs is long and our budget is limited so if there are ways you would like to contribute please contact us. Please contact Gill Kette on 0417 805 304.

We hope to have it operational during the 2012 season.



PREMIER TEAM REPORT

We understand Hayley is recovering well from her operation now and we look forward to her getting back on her feet as soon as possible. We would also like to thank Chanel (Reserve keeper) who had to step into the role at short notice which did not allow her time to prepare for the final. The girls played extremely well in the final and didn't let Olympic have it easy but again luck was not with us and lost the final 4-2.

A special mention must go out to our players who have been selected in the National Women's League team: Greta French-Kennedy, Daniela Di Bartolo and Grace Henry. Also to Grace Henry who has been selected to represent the Under 17 Young Matildas who are off to play in China. We wish them all the very best.

I would also like to thank the coaching staff; Edoardo, Anthony and Steve (GK Trainer) to Frank our trainer for yet another tireless season working with us. We look forward to a refreshed start to season 2012.

Well done to the Under 15 Blue team for a very strong finish to season 2011. In the final five games of the season the Under 15 Blue team:

- Completely outplayed Sturt Marion who had beaten us very comfortably earlier this year.
- After conceding 3 early goals against Adelaide Hills, held the runaway leaders of the league scoreless and were unlucky not to pull a goal back in the 2nd half.
- Held the very physical Port Pirates scoreless until the final five minutes of the game in a game in which if we had scored first we probably would have won the game.
- Given Parafield Gardens a real shock necessitating their self appointed referee to become their 12th player in the 2nd half to try to swing the result their way.
- In the final game of the season, put in a fantastic performance against Adelaide Blue Eagles, pinned Blue Eagles in their own half for long periods of the game and were the better team on the day.

Over the final 5 weeks of the season the Under 15 Blue team turned around its season and demonstrated it had become a match for every team in the league. It has been a tough season against very tough opposition but the most important measure of a team's success is how much it has improved over the season. To this end the players of the Under 15 Blue team should be very proud of their efforts.

8 months ago we started training with a disjointed squad without a goalkeeper, with almost no defenders and with five first year club football players. It took time for the team to find its feet and this was not helped by being physically hammered by our much larger and older opponents. But the team showed real character to fight back and by the end of the season the squad had become a unified team with a resolute defence in front of a determined goalkeeper that, in their best moments, could outplay their opponents through moving the ball to feet.

This is my fifth season of coaching at Adelaide City and the Under 15 Blue are the team of which I am most proud. They have overcome so much adversity this year, with no assistant coach, no goalkeeper coach, no development coach, little support from referees on the physical aspect of our opponents, opponents that are at least 1 year older and in many cases 2 years older, placement in the wrong division by the FFSA and all whilst our club rooms/facilities appear to be going backwards before they can go forward. Individually many of the players have taken some very big strides forward over the course of the season and shown a lot of strength of character which will hold them in good stead for their future both as footballers and as individuals.

Finally a very big thank you to the helpers. At the top of the list is Sheree who has done a great job as team manger but there are many others that have helped out as stand-in team managers, referees, linesman, putting up nets, checking the field, warming up the goalkeeper etc. Adelaide City is a community club and it only exists because of all of the support that comes from parents.

UNDER 11 HURRICANES TEAM REPORT

For some reason, it seems as though the last season feels like two years instead of one year – and to some extent, that's probably correct with pre-season trials starting straight after the end of the 2010 season

Pre-season started with 26 eager young ladies wanting to play for Adelaide City's Under 11's in 2011. This was a marked difference in comparison to the 12 fantastic girls that took the field for the Under 11's in 2010.

Trials started in October 2010 and it also included a few sessions in November and December before we decided to split the squad in to 2 teams – The Tornadoes (coached by Joe Maio) and The Hurricanes (coached by myself and ably assisted by Ian Stone).

My aim before the first game against Adelaide University was to ensure the parents that they saw an improvement in the skills shown by their daughters by the time the last game of the season was going to be played in the middle of September against Fulham United. To say that we have already achieved this in a total understatement!

The Under 11's Hurricanes played 20 games this season – winning 18 and losing just 1 game with 1 draw in the final round of the season – a 0-0 draw with Fulham United Black – the best game of Junior Football I have ever seen – boys or girls.

The teams scored 98 goals and conceded just 7 – a credit to the tight defence and excellent goal-keeping this season.

The girls have been simply sensational. They talk a lot at training but it just means that the volume of the whistle gets louder. But this translates to effective listening and putting in to practice what we drum in to them at training.

And when I say we, I can't forget to mention the super efforts of my assistant coach, Ian Stone. He never let me down. When I couldn't take training for whatever reason, Ian would capably step in to fill the role. Ian, I would like to sincerely thank you for your efforts with the girls so far this season. You are also the reason behind the success of this team.

Also, I can't forget to mention the efforts of Soula Spyridonidis our team manager. Everything is so organised in her capable hands – one less thing for the coach and assistant coach to worry about on game day.

Finally, I would like to express my gratitude to parents of the Under 11 girls – they support their daughters, they support me and they support the team as a whole. They are sensational. Thanks guys!

There is absolutely no doubt that there has been a massive improvement in the skills and tactical understanding shown by all the girls.
